

A GUIDE TO OFF-CAMPUS LIVING

WHAT TO QUESTION AND CONSIDER



PLAN AHEAD

- You can start planning well in advance, preferably a semester or more before your intended move-out date.
- Consider your budget, location preferences, and the type of housing you want (i.e., apartment, house, shared accommodation).



BUDGETING

- Calculate all anticipated expenses, including rent, utilities, groceries, transportation, and renter's insurance.
- Create a budget and stick to it.



UTILITIES & FACILITIES

- Set up utilities (i.e., electricity, water, gas, internet, cable, garbage/recycling) in your name or coordinate with roommates.
- Ask what facilities are provided and where they are located.



RESEARCH

- Explore different offcampus housing options near TCU by attending our Off-Campus Housing Fair and using sites like Rent College Pads to help navigate your options.
- Consider factors such as safety, proximity to campus, public transportation access, and amenities.

LEASE AGREEMENT

 Carefully read and understand your lease agreement before signing. Pay attention to the terms, lease duration, and any penalties.

ROOMMATES

- Decide whether you want to live alone or with roommates. Sharing expenses can be costeffective.
- If you choose roommates, ensure your living habits, cleanliness, and financial responsibilities are compatible.



FURNITURE AND SUPPLIES

- Determine what furniture and household items you need. Decide whether you want a new, used, or furnished apartment.
- Start collecting these items gradually to spread out the costs.





SAFETY & SECURITY

- Invest in security measures such as door locks, window locks, and possibly a security system.
- Know your neighbors and keep emergency numbers handy
- numbers handy.
 Explore transportation options to get to campus.



MOVING LOGISTICS

- Organize the moving process well in advance. Gather packing supplies and boxes, and enlist help from friends or family if needed
- if needed.
 Notify TCU of your new address for important mail and documents.

COMMUNITY QUESTION GUIDE

WHAT TO QUESTION AND CONSIDER

COST & PAYMENT

- What is the cost of rent?
- Is there an application fee? If so, how much?
- What is the security deposit requirement? How can I ensure I get it back?
- What payment methods are preferred/required? Do you utilize an app?
- What utilities are included? Does this include lawn care (if applicable)?
- If utilities are not included, what is the average monthly cost, and which services are they? How do I open an account with the utility companies?
- what is your trash schedule/pick-up? is there a one-time or monthly fee?

REQUIREMENTS

- Do you conduct a credit check to live at the location?
- Do you perform a background check?
- Do you require a guarantor?
- How quickly will I know if I am approved?

LEASE TERMS

- What is the lease length? Do you offer different lease lengths? (By semester vs. 6-month vs. 1 year, etc.)
- Do you offer individual leases or per-unit lease?
- How many people are allowed per room?
- Can I sublet my unit/property if needed? If so, are there costs associated with that and how much?

PROPERTY SPECIFICS

- What various floor plans/unit types are there to choose from at your property?
- What amenities are included?
- Do you offer roommate matching?
- What is security like on the property?
- What types of parking options are available and what are the costs? Is there guest parking?
- Do you allow pets? If so, are there any restrictions, and what is the pet deposit? Is there a monthly pet fee, or is it when signing the lease?
- What is the property distance from campus?

Are you running any current promotions?

- What is your turn around on maintenance requests?
- What is the process if I lock myself out after hours?
- What is the crime rate for this community? Do you have an officer or security on-site?
- Is there anything else you think I should know about your property?
